

NEEDLES

3

1 pair 3¼mm (no 10) (US 3) needles 3¼mm (no 10) (US 3) circular needle, 100 cm long

TENSION

30 sts and 36 rows to 10 cm measured over patt using 3½mm (US 3) needles.

Stripe sequence

Rows 1 to 4: Using yarn A.

Rows 5 to 8: Using yarn B. Rows 9 to 12: Using yarn C.

These 12 rows form stripe sequence and are repeated throughout.

Pattern note: When working lace pattern, do **NOT** work an inc unless there are sufficient sts to work the corresponding dec so that the number of sts remains constant (except where shaping occurs). You may find it helpful to place markers on needle at edge of side patt reps and work sts beyond these markers in st st, moving markers out as required.

BACK

Using 3¼mm (US 3) needles and yarn A, cast on 127 [155: 169: 183] sts.

Row 1 (RS): *K1 tbl, K13 * to last st, K1 tbl.

Row 2: *P1 tbl, P13, rep from * to last st, P1 tbl.

Row 3: *K1 tbl, K4tog, (yfwd, K1) 5 times, yfwd, K4tog tbl, rep from * to last st. K1 tbl.

Row 4: As row 2.

These 4 rows form patt.

Cont in patt in stripe sequence (see above) beg with row 5, as folls: Cont straight until back meas 47 [48: 49: 50] cm, ending with RS facing for next row.

Shape sleeves

Cast on 21 [25: 27: 27] sts at beg of next 2 rows, taking inc sts into patt. 169 [205: 223: 237] sts. (Change to circular needle if required). Cont straight until sleeve meas approx 17 [18: 19: 20] cm from caston sts, ending with stripe row 4 and with RS facing for next row.

Shape shoulders

Keeping patt correct, cast off 3 [4: 4: 5] sts at beg of next 24 [24: 8: 30] rows, then 4 [5: 5: 6] sts at beg of foll 12 [12: 28: 6] rows. Cast off rem 49 [49: 51: 51] sts using yarn A.

FRONT

Using 3¼mm (US 3) needles and yarn A, cast on 169 [197: 211: 225] sts.

Cont in patt in stripe sequence (see above) beg with row 1, as folls:

Cont straight until front matches back to beg of sleeve shaping, ending with RS facing for next row.

Shape sleeves

Cast on 21 [25: 27: 27] sts at beg of next 2 rows, taking inc sts into patt. 211 [247: 265: 279] sts. (Change to circular needle if required). Cont straight until front matches back to beg of shoulder shaping, ending with RS facing for next row.

Shape shoulders

Keeping patt correct, cast off 3 [4: 4: 5] sts at beg of next 24 [24: 8: 30] rows, then 4 [5: 5: 6] sts at beg of foll 12 [12: 28: 6] rows. Cast off rem 91 [91: 93: 93] sts using yarn A.

MAKING UP

Press.

Join shoulder seams using back stitch, or mattress stitch if preferred.

Cuffs (both alike)

With RS facing and using $3\frac{1}{4}$ mm (US 3) needles and yarn A, pick up and knit 92 [97: 103: 108] sts evenly around cuff edge.

Work 4 rows in g st.

Cast off on knitwise on WS.

Belt

Using $3\frac{1}{4}$ mm (US 3) circular needle and yarn A, cast on 378 [392: 405: 418] sts.

Work 4 rows in g st.

Cast off.

Sew in side seams.
