

# Jubilee Bunting

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#### YARN

2	x 50gm
1	x 50gm
1	$\ge 50$ gm
	1

(To make bunting as shown on image use yarn amounts above, if making more pieces adjust yarn accordingly).

#### NEEDLES

1 pair 4mm (no 8) (US 6) needles

#### TENSION

22 sts and 30 rows to 10cm meas over st st using 4mm (US 6) needles.

#### EXTRAS

Approx. 200 small silver beads. 1cm wide ribbon, approx. 2.5m in length.

#### FINISHED SIZE

Completed bunting piece should meas  $17 \text{ cm} (6\frac{1}{2} \text{ in})$  at widest point and  $19 \text{ cm} (7\frac{1}{2} \text{ in})$  at longest point.

#### SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

**bead 1** = place a bead by taking yarn to RS of work and slipping bead up next to st just worked, slip next st purlwise from left needle to right needle and take yarn back to WS of work, leaving bead sitting in front of slipped st on RS.

**Beading note:** Before starting to knit, thread beads onto yarn. To do this, thread a fine sewing needle (one that will easily pass through the beads) with sewing thread. Knot ends of thread and then pass end of yarn through this loop. Thread

a bead onto sewing thread and then gently slide it along and onto knitting yarn. Continue in this way until required number of beads are on yarn.

#### UNION JACK BUNTING

Using 4mm (US 6) needles and yarn A cast on 2 sts. Using the intarsia technique now work in patt from chart until all 68 rows have been completed, ending with RS facing for next row.

Cast off.

#### DIAMOND BEADED BUNTING

Using 4mm (US 6) needles and yarn A cast on 3 sts. Work in patt from chart until all 68 rows have been completed, ending with a RS facing for next row. Cast off.

#### **CROWN BUNTING**

Using 4mm (US 6) needles and yarn C cast on 2 sts. Work in patt from chart until all 68 rows have been completed.

Cast off.

Using the Swiss darning technique and yarn B complete crown motif from chart starting at row 34 and cont to row 60.

#### PLAIN BUNTING


Using 4mm needles and either yarn A, B or C cast on 2 sts. Work in patt from chart until all 68 rows have been completed, ending with RS facing for next row. Cast off.

#### MAKING UP

If you require a longer piece of bunting then you can knit as

many as required, noting you may need more yarn. Press lightly on WS following instruction on ball band. Using photograph as a guide, sew ribbon along the top edge at the back of each piece of bunting, leaving a 3cm gap between each bunting piece.





key for Union Jack Bunting




K on RS, P on WS using yarn A
